LORD DAVID PUTTNAM & LEADING VIETNAMESE FILMMAKERS EXCHANGE IDEAS FOR FLOURISHING CREATIVE COMMUNITY



HANOI-SINGAPORE: On January 26, the Motion Picture Association (MPA) with the support of the British Council and CGV Arthouse presented *A Conversation With Lord David Puttnam*, where Lord Puttnam discussed with some of Vietnam's leading and emerging filmmakers a range of ideas aimed at developing the Vietnamese film industry.

Speaking at the event, Lord Puttnam described the occasion as, "A thoroughly stimulating exchange on the present and the future potential of Vietnamese filmmaking, and the opportunities and challenges of the global market place."

Leading Vietnamese filmmaker Director Bùi Thạc Chuyên said the special event was "...a very useful conversation where Vietnamese filmmakers were inspired to train their thoughts, feelings and energy towards the audience and by doing so convince the audience to think, rather than making films only for filmmakers."

Mr Kim In Chul – Operations Director of CJ CGV Vietnam encouraged the filmmakers present to pursue their vision: "Please never give up your dreams in making film – just let your imagination and creativity fly high, and turn your ideas into impressive, quality films. You are the ones who can find the balance between commercial and art films in Vietnam."

Susan Lee, Director of Operations & Special Projects Asia Pacific, MPA, said, "The Vietnamese screen community is blossoming with talented filmmakers and new stories for the cinema, which bodes well for audiences. We are incredibly fortunate to have Lord David Puttnam spend time with so many of the brightest talents in the Vietnamese film industry for an intimate exchange of ideas. We hope that this dialogue encourages further growth, and a vibrant, expansive screen community where creative works are respected and valued."

Among his many roles and responsibilities, Lord Puttnam is the UK Prime Minister's Trade Envoy to Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia, and Burma. In October 2014, Lord Puttnam was the MPA guest speaker at the MPA-DHU Film Workshop and MPA Seminar as part of the Tokyo International Film Festival.
