MPAA STUDIOS RE-AFFIRM THEIR COMMITMENT TO TAKE ACTION WHERE THEIR RIGHTS AS CONTENT OWNERS HAVE BEEN VIOLATED

BEIJING/SINGAPORE: On January 19, 2015, MPAA studios filed civil actions against Shenzhen Xunlei Networking Technologies Co. (Xunlei), a large Chinese-language video website in China, alleging various acts of copyright infringement. The actions were filed in the Nanshan District Court in Shenzhen, seeking damages, claims for orders to stop the infringing activity, a public apology, and requesting that Xunlei bear the studios' litigation costs.

On January 28, Mike Ellis, President and Managing Director Asia Pacific, Motion Picture Association, representing the MPAA in the Asia Pacific, reiterated: "Content creators and rights holders will continue to exercise their rights under the law and seek judicial remedy where the rights of content owners have been violated."
