NEW GENERATION OF FILMMAKING TALENT UNCOVERED AT TROPFEST NZ

Winner Gabriel Reid scores LA film immersion course for "Every Moment" thanks to MPA

NEW ZEALAND/SINGAPORE: On February 14, Gabriel Reid took home the top prize at Tropfest New Zealand for his film *Every Moment*, winning a five-day film immersion course in Los Angeles thanks to the support of the Motion Picture Association (MPA).

Reid's film *Every Moment* is a short, poignant love story on the importance of making every moment count. *Every Moment* was one of 16 finalist short films that delighted an estimated crowd of 9,000 at the TSB Bowl of Brooklands in New Plymouth, home of Tropfest New Zealand for the past three years.

Accepting his award, Reid said, "One of the most exciting aspects of Tropfest is the film industry immersion course. Along with filmmakers from around the world, I'll get to spend a week in meetings and seminars with production houses, studios, agents and managers, and I'll get to visit the American Film Market – something I've wanted to do for many years. While my primary focus has always been to direct, the business aspects of this industry are also of enormous interest to me. I recognize that film financing and distribution are these days a complex field and the better it is understood by filmmakers the better off they'll be. It's essential we understand how to pitch projects and how to develop and package our films in such a way that will connect with financiers and audiences. As they say, without the 'business' there is no 'show'. I have several projects I'm keen to step through development and into production, so I'm absolutely thrilled to be afforded the opportunity to participate in this film immersion course. In coming months, I'll work with my team to ensure we have a plan to utilize this opportunity to the fullest extent possible. I am tremendously grateful to Tropfest, the MPA and the New Zealand Screen Association (NZSA) for making this possible."

Mike Ellis, President and Managing Director Asia Pacific, MPA said, "Tropfest is a short film festival phenomenon that continues to offer a huge platform for emerging filmmakers to not only show their films to large live and online audiences, but also in many cases jump-starts careers, providing access to film and television industry players, agents and mentors. The quality of New Zealand filmmaking was certainly on show during this year's competition, and we will watch with interest as winner Gabriel Reid and others develop new projects and grow the audience for their films. Congratulations again to all of the filmmakers and to the Tropfest team who really do put on a great show."

The judges for the 2015 festival included James Napier Robertson, director of the multiple award-winning film *The Dark Horse*, Composer and Best Score winner Dana Lund for *The Dark Horse*, director of *Scarfies* and *Out of the Blue* Robert Sarkies, entertainment lawyer and president of both SPADA (Screen Production and Development Association) and WIFT (Women in Film and Television) Karen Soich, award-winning writer,

director and producer Gaylene Preston, and Kiwi editor of the *Directory of World Cinema: Australia & New Zealand 2* and film lecturer at Waikato University, Geoff Lealand.
